- 1. Agardhianum: Office and information.
- 2. Greenhouse. Open daily 11 am to 3 pm.
- 3. Toilets.
- 4. Café Botan, open daily 11 am to 6 pm, April–September.
- 5. Old Botanical Museum.
- 6. Gula Villan.
- 7. Rock Garden, a collection of plants mainly from mountain areas, and many are spring-flowering.
- 8. Spice and Medicinal Garden, plants used for a wide variety of purposes medicinal, culinary and aromatic.
- 9. Economic Plants, vegetables, cereals and old kitchen plants.
- 10. Systematic Section, plants arranged systematically. The monocotyledons grow in the western part and the dicotyledons in the eastern part.
- 11. Ornamental plants, modern cultivars of annuals and perennials grown for inspiration and beauty.
- "Skånes stenar", a collection of stones found in the province of Scania.
